In addition to providing engaging programming for the Circle of Friends program, our staff will be hands on in monitoring and supporting all activities and developing relationships.

The Center for Disability Services ensures all staff successfully complete in-depth and ongoing training to best serve the individuals we serve. Training includes, but not limited to:

- All CDS staff undergo ten (10) different background checks, as well as drug and alcohol screening.
